Maritime KiwiSaver Scheme – Growth Fund for the year ended 31 March 2026

This fund update was first made publicly available on 30 June 2026.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS UPDATE?

This document tells you how the fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. The Trustees of the Maritime KiwiSaver Scheme prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013.

This information is not audited and may be updated.

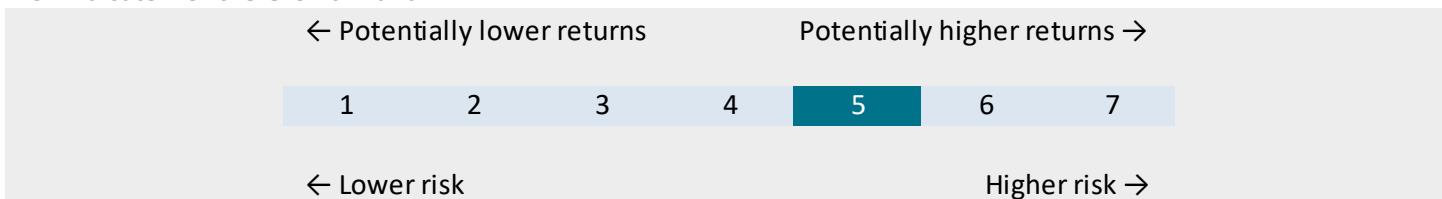
DESCRIPTION OF THIS FUND

Invests about 20% in bonds and cash with about 80% in shares and other growth assets. Suited to longer-term investors who want a diversified portfolio of assets with a high exposure to shares and other growth assets and are willing to accept more ups and downs than can be expected from the Balanced and Conservative Funds.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS OF INVESTING?

Risk indicator for the Growth Fund¹:



The risk indicator for the Growth Fund is 5. The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

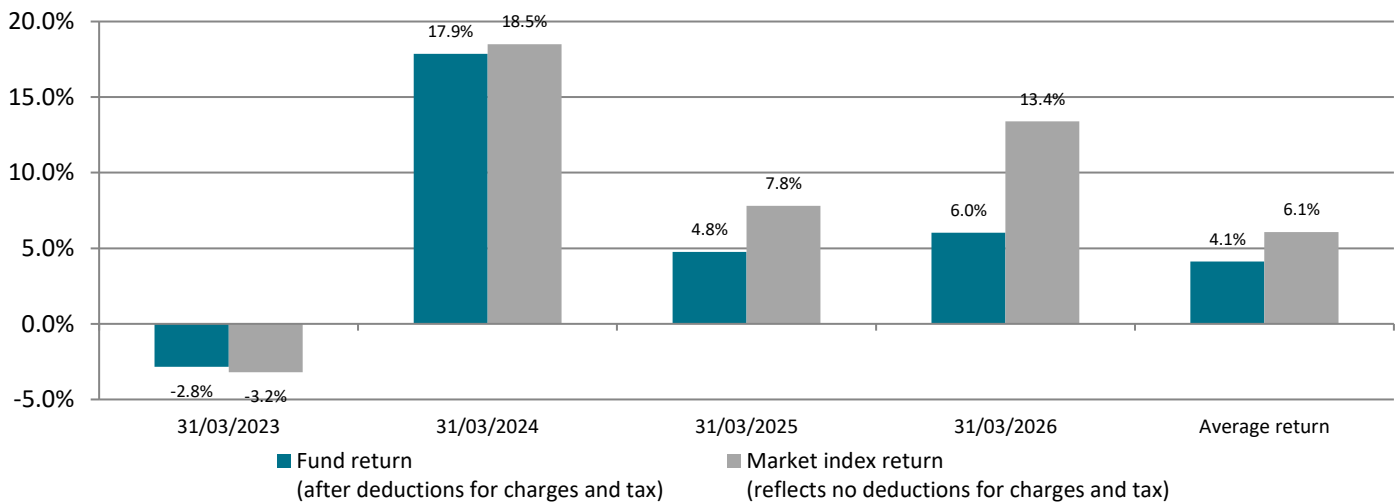

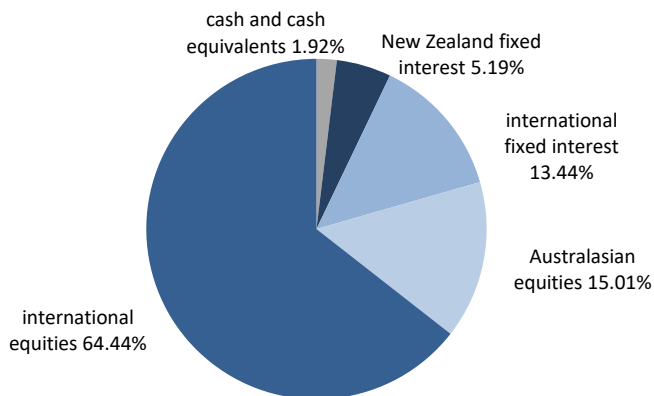
EXAMPLE OF HOW THIS APPLIES TO AN INVESTOR

Brian had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Brian received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$688 (that is 6.88% of his initial \$10,000. No other charges were deducted. This gives Brian a total return after tax of \$603 for the year.

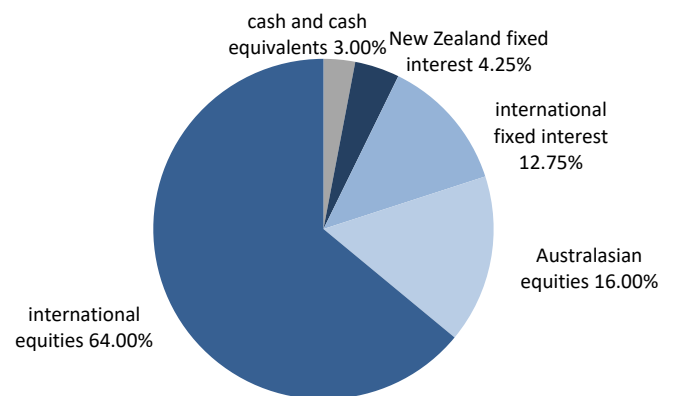
Actual investment mix

NOTES

1. The Maritime KiwiSaver Scheme Growth Fund only commenced on 1 October 2021 and therefore has not yet been in operation for 5 years. The risk indicator for this Fund has been calculated using composite index returns data for the period 1 April 2021 to 30 September 2021, and actual returns for the period 1 October 2021 to 31 March 2026. As a result of composite index returns data being used, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of this Fund.
